#### **Cherish the Ladies: A Cervical Cancer Screening Program in Southeast Haiti - April 7**



On April 7 at 5:30pm in the Driscoll Hall Auditorium, enjoy the story of family nurse practitioner Louise Lindenmeyr who took new technology to screen women for cervical cancer to the far-flung corners of Haiti. Strapping a CO2 tank to the back of a motorcycle, Louise built a program of "see and treat" and has screened approximately 600 women so far and has treated 5% of those women for positive results with cryotherapy. Even more importantly, in the spring of 2014 she began training Haitian doctors and nurses in the use of VIA/cryo. Now there is a fully trained Haitian nurse doing the screenings, treatments and supervising trainees in a large southeast Haiti community.
